
The values chosen

An unusually large number of values were chosen - 14 for the three issues taken together.

The small values (1,2 and 3 cents) were intended for use in combination to make up larger amounts.

For the others the postal authorities planned for a wide range of prospective postage due requirements by calibrating the values with their gold centimes equivalents at the prevailing conversion rate of 1 Zanzibar cent = 1.6 gold centimes (allowing for rounding). This conversion rate lasted throughout the local issue period.

The inherent difficulty of the 'squared' rather than the 'mitred' ends to the box rules (sheet 8) was exacerbated throughout the second issue. For example:



Printings

Recorded dates of use show the latest date by which each value must have been produced. Within these date limits, plating analysis can be used to work out the probable production sequence.

The exhibitor has identified seven printings, all of which happened by mid 1930. The 'cent.s' error inherited from the first issue remained through the first four printings of the second. The error was removed with the production of the 1 cent in the fifth printing, a change that was carried forward into the sixth and seventh printings.
